Situated in the beautiful Rocky Mountain Foothills, Calgary rates as the world's cleanest city and boasts a surrounding playground of mountains and rivers that attract and retain some of the adventurous and energetic individuals that make up Calgary's workforce.



GEOGRAPHICAL SIZE:

746 square kilometres

ELEVATION:

1,084.1 metres (3,556.8 feet) above sea level

CLIMATE:

- :: Over 2,300 hours of sunshine annually
- :: Sunniest days year-round of major Canadian cities
- :: Summer temperature (June – August)
 - :: Average high: 21.9°C (71.4°F)
 - :: Average low: 8.43°C (47.2°F)
- :: Winter temperature (December – February)
 - :: Average high: -1.4°C (29.5°F)
 - :: Average low: -13.5°C (7.7°F)
- :: Warm, dry Chinook winds routinely blow in from the Pacific Ocean during the winter, giving Calgarians a break from the cold. These winds often raise the temperature by up to 15 °C (27 °F) in just a few hours, and may last several days.

POPULATION:

- :: City of Calgary (April 2007): 1,020,000
- :: Youngest population in Canada, with a median age of 35

EDUCATION:

- :: Calgary has the largest public school system in Western Canada
- :: Post-secondary institutions include four universities, 14 colleges, two technical institutes and one Centre for Continuing Education

AIR ACCESS:

- :: Fourth busiest airport in Canada with 12.2 Million passengers in 2007
- :: Direct flights to London, Toronto, Montreal, Vancouver

HOUSING:

- :: On average, Calgary offers more affordable housing than Vancouver, Toronto and Montreal
- :: Median House Price, Single Family, \$406,788 (December 2007)

WAGES:

- :: Highest average wages of any major Canadian city
- :: Average hourly pay rate: \$24.83 (Alberta Wage and Salary Survey)
- :: Average annual salary: \$58,390 (Conference Board of Canada)

LIFESTYLE:

A focus on family and a sense of community

- :: Calgary received two Safe Community designations (World Health Authority, Safe Communities Foundation)
- :: Calgary schools are consistently top performers in Alberta
- :: Volunteer capital of Canada at 71 per cent (more than twice the national volunteer rate)

- :: A one hour drive to spectacular Banff and the Rocky Mountains
- :: The most extensive urban pathway and bikeway system in North America
- :: World-class attractions and sporting amenities including the Calgary Stampede, Calgary Zoo, Canada Olympic Park
- :: Abundant green space and parks (3,000 sites)
- :: A community rich in the arts, culture, entertainment, and leisure activities and venues
