WHAT IS IT?

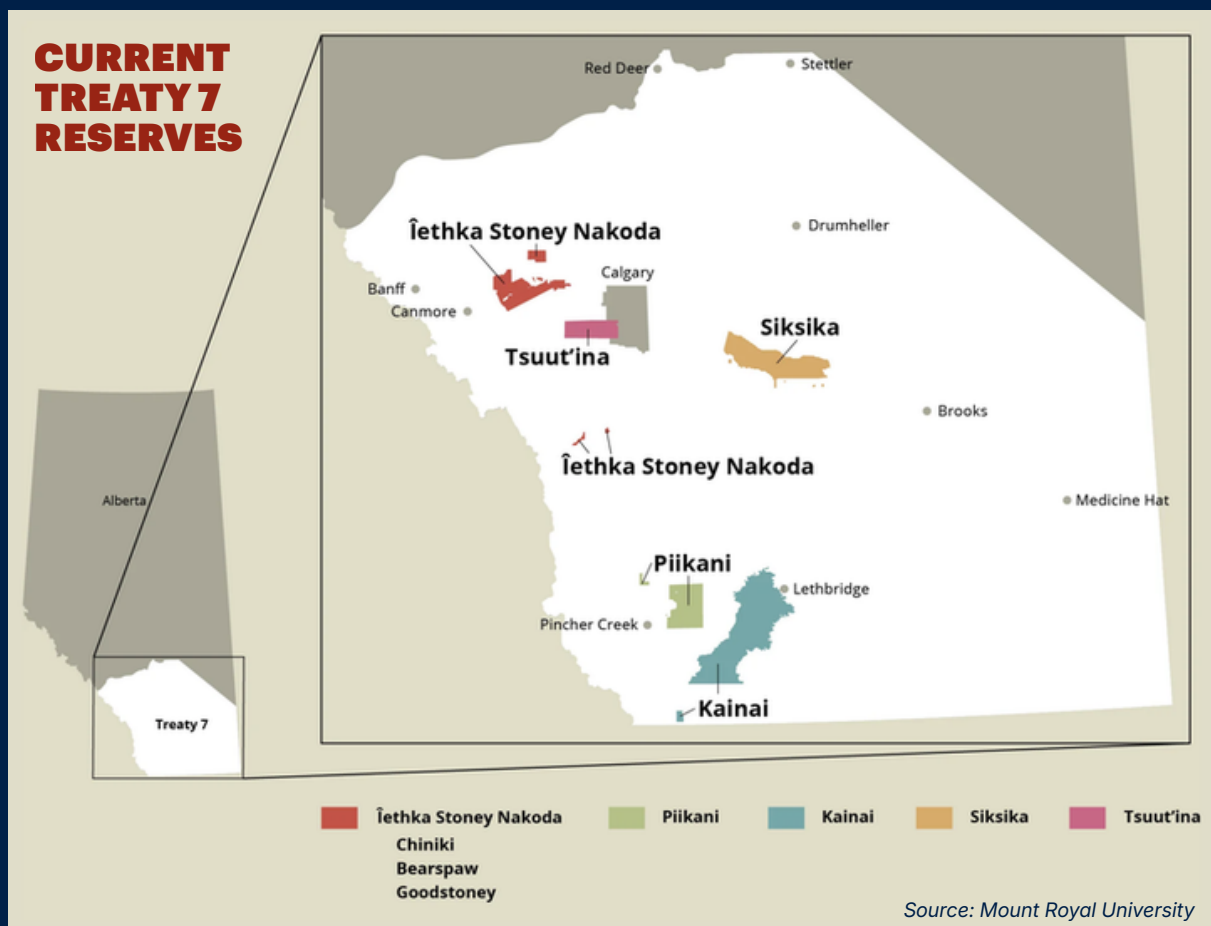
Respect on Set is a Treaty 7 film production guide for Indigenous engagement.

Developed by Two Canoes Media and informed by Treaty 7 consultations, the manual outlines protocols and best practices for building relationships with Indigenous communities and lands in Treaty 7 territory (Calgary and Southern Alberta).

WHICH INDIGENOUS COMMUNITIES ARE REPRESENTED IN THE GUIDE?

Treaty 7 includes the Nations of Siksika, Piikani, Kainai, Bearspaw, Chiniki, Goodstoney and Tsuut'ina. Calgary is also home to the Otipemisiwak Métis Government (Districts 5 and 6), plus the many First Nations and Inuit who have lived in and cared for these lands for generations.

Respect on Set advises that each Nation has distinct protocols and cultural practices that productions should be aware of.



WHY ARE INDIGENOUS ENGAGEMENT PROTOCOLS IMPORTANT?

Great storytelling starts with respect. By adopting the guide's recommended practices, productions will not only meet the growing industry standard for responsible filmmaking, but enhance the authenticity of their storytelling.

Through tools, stories and best practices, this guide supports filmmakers in establishing trust, consent and cultural safety during each stage of production.
